2020 was quite a year... But it wouldn't have been the same without you. While the coronavirus has taken hold in our lives, sweeping aside all our usual reference points, we managed to rise up from this ordeal stronger than ever before.





Sometimes physical distance helps us find other ways to get closer. Through confidences shared over the phone, which we might not have shared in person. Also via a screen, one that became an open door to a world we would not have had access to otherwise.

This was the experience of thousands of the Quebec Cancer Foundation's beneficiaries. It may seem paradoxical, but despite the circumstances, it seems that we have never been so close to our people.

In fact, in 2020, we reached a level of presence unmatched in the Foundation's history.

As soon as the pandemic began, the government declared our Accommodation Centers and Info-cancer Services as "essential services." Thanks to the ingenuity of our teams, we were able to maintain our services while respecting the public health and sanitary measures while ensuring the safety of all.

Our Info-cancer Services have never been so much in demand, both by those living with cancer and by their loved ones. Our services meet a factual need. We have launched our 2020-2022 strategic plan, opened a new Lodge in Lévis, created an online

resource directory containing over 2,200 oncology resources to help provide answers at any time of the day or night. Also, a growing number of our complementary therapies have been converted to virtual format, which now allows us — and we are particularly proud of this — to reach people living in every corner of the province, from Gaspé to Abitibi.

Our online group workshops, such as art therapy and online yoga, have been so successful that we have had to increase the offering from one to several time slots per week.

And we want it to last. Because offering support on a daily basis also involves adapting to this new reality. It means listening to people's fears and needs. And it means reaching out to them wherever they are, whenever they need it most. Whether it's in the wards of an oncology unit or in their own living rooms — converted for the occasion into an art workshop or a home yoga studio.

Of course, a screen could never convey the human warmth of a sincere hug or the experienced hands of our massage therapists, which is why we will always give priority to in-person services.

Our "Accommodation Service"

component, considered an essential service since the beginning of the crisis, has never ceased its activities. And the 2021 opening of a new Lodge in Quebec City will bring us up to a total of 6 regional Accommodation Centers across the province! With its 270 beds throughout Quebec, the Foundation will now have a capacity of 35,000 overnight stays per year, to accommodate people who live far away from their treatment location.

But until then, with your support, we will use every means to stay connected to our mission. And above all, to the men and women who are our reason for being.

Fortunately, the support you have given to us has shown us that solidarity and benevolence still exist. After all, we are all closer to each other than we think.

Let's continue to empower ourselves to transform that human connection into resilience while facing cancer.

An ambitious strategic plan worthy of our mission

In June 2020, the Quebec Cancer Foundation's Board of Directors and its General Manager Marco Décelles unveiled the organization's 2020-2022 Strategic Plan: *Being Closer to People*.

This dynamic and ambitious plan will allow us to meet the new challenges of the 2020s in an even more relevant way, especially with the current context.

Board members, management, employees, and multiple partners and collaborators of the Foundation were consulted in order to deliver a strategic plan including every crucial component needed to support people impacted by cancer, now and tomorrow.

Specific measures for achieving these goals are presented throughout this strategic plan.

This plan is also intended to be a response to the issues of the current healthcare system, as cancer has become the leading cause of death in the country. Additionally, one in two Quebecers will face cancer in their lifetime.

It is in this context of change that the Foundation has decided to adopt an ambitious plan to be able to continue to live up to its mission: meeting the increased demand for services from people dealing with cancer and their loved ones.

In this first year of a three-year cycle and in the context of the global health crisis, we have already achieved many of the improvements described in the three strategic pillars. Here is a status report on our progress.







Always closer to people thanks to our new services

A new Lodge opens in Lévis

Being closer to people is not just a catchy tagline. To achieve this goal, we have decided to extend our accommodation network to the Chaudière-Appalaches region, with the opening of Maison Dessercom.

Local residents who need to travel for repeated treatments without hospitalization at the Hôtel- Dieu de Lévis or at the Regional Integrated Cancerology Centre (CRIC) can now be accommodated in this comfortable, peaceful, accessible and affordable building. Financed entirely by Dessercom, at a cost of \$7 million, Maison Dessercom was a central project in the Fondation Hôtel-Dieu de Lévis' major campaign.

More than just hotels, the Quebec Cancer Foundation's Lodges are true living spaces where employees and volunteers generously impart the warmth, humanity and creativity essential to alleviate the daily lives of residents.

To enhance the healing process, we offer various services such as massage therapy, kinesiology, art therapy, hair prosthesis loan services, etc.

The Lodges are mutual support spaces where beautiful victories take place, both over oneself and over the disease. Every day bears witness to the beneficial effects of therapies designed to complement the medical treatments. This living environment and these activities undeniably help people cope better with cancer.







The online resource directory

The Quebec Cancer Foundation wants to make its services more accessible to as many Quebecers as possible. This is why, in the summer of 2020, the Foundation launched an online resource directory, developed especially for the healthcare network and for people facing cancer and their loved ones.

This bilingual French-English directory contains over 2,200 resources in oncology compiled over the past 25 years, for the needs of clients 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. In just a few months, over 3,300 people visited the website for a resource in their community.


The directory has no less than 9 categories of resources, ranging from complementary therapies, breast and hair prostheses, palliative care, home care, transportation or self-help and support. Whether they are looking for a certified oncology yoga teacher in Vald'Or or home care in La Tuque, cancer

patients and their loved ones will be able to find the contact information of oncology organizations or resources in the vicinity of their home or treatment site.

This is one more way in which The Quebec Cancer Foundation confirms its role as a unifying leader, bringing together all the organizations and services available to people facing cancer in Quebec.

The Foundation's services in the digital age

Whether it's through the online availability of our resource directory, now available in French and English, or through the adaptation of our art therapy to virtual format, kinesiology, yoga or Qi Gong services, we are drawing closer to our goal of being closer to the world every day.

With over 1,000 participations in the various complementary therapy sessions offered online in the last months of 2020, it is clear that this digital shift has generated a strong buzz in the community living with cancer. Art therapy has grown considerably in popularity, from one session to four per week. In addition to breaking isolation, which is particularly burdensome in these exceptional times, the workshops offered by the Foundation have a tangible impact on the physical and mental well-being of people with cancer.

Our virtual library also provides expanded access to accurate and relevant information. Cancer raises thousands of questions to which answers need to be provided easily and quickly. With its multitude of documentary resources adapted to the needs of people living with cancer and their loved ones, this library provides real added value.



Complementary in-person therapies

In compliance with the measures imposed by the health authorities with regard to COVID-19, the Quebec Cancer Foundation suspended its complementary activities and therapies as of March 13. From then on, the Foundation has been channeling its creative energies to maintain support to Quebecers with cancer and their loved ones. The services we offer have been redesigned in order to allow us to maintain them as much as possible.

In June, we announced the gradual resumption of the art therapy

workshops and kinesiology sessions for people with cancer in five of our regional centers in Montreal, Québec City, Sherbrooke, Gatineau and Trois-Rivières. And as of September, in all our accommodation centers, cancer patients were once again able to benefit from massages given by our massage therapists specialized in masso-oncology certified by the Fédération québécoise des massothérapeutes.

The physiological and psychological benefits of these massages are undeniable, and are widely recognized by the scientific community. Among other things, they help alleviate several symptoms of cancer, while increasing the degree of relaxation, enhancing quality of sleep and improving immune

system response.

One program that we hope to be able to reintroduce very soon is in-chair massages. Cancer patients will be able to benefit from chair massages during chemotherapy treatments in more than 20 hospitals across Quebec.


Because each type of cancer has its own particular profile, chair massages require very specific expertise in order to successfully create the most beneficial moment of intimacy in the setting of the oncology ward. This is why all our massage therapists are specifically trained in oncology.

Starting in May, hundreds of Quebecers of all ages and backgrounds mobilized across the province for the 3rd edition of *La marche du Grand défoulement*, presented by Mallette and converted to "La marche de chez toi" due to COVID-19 this year.

Together, despite these difficult times, they raised nearly \$260,000 on behalf of the Quebec Cancer Foundation. The organizers of the walk invited the hundreds of team captains, participants and donors to celebrate life, while remaining connected but physically distant, in a virtual show that took place on October 24.

The innovative virtual and physical formula of *La marche de chez toi*, allowed Quebecers to show their solidarity with people impacted by cancer, in complete safety and in compliance with public health regulations. This year, in the comfort of their homes and in their neighborhoods all across Quebec, they joined forces by walking and raising a record amount for the Foundation.

"In these uncertain times, this vast movement of solidarity is proof that humanitarianism is alive and well in Quebec [...] In the face of this devastating scourge [cancer], you are here, like a ray of hope at the end of the tunnel. Your altruism is a true source of inspiration for all of us," acknowledged Marco Décelles, General Manager of the Quebec Cancer Foundation, addressing the generous and courageous participants of *La marche de chez toi*.

In 2020, 56,800 Quebecers will be diagnosed with cancer. Even though the whole world was guarantined, cancer never let up for a moment. The walkers were well aware of this. and decided to commit themselves even more determinedly, sending a message of hope to anyone impacted by cancer, whether far or close. They took up several challenges by walking 30 minutes, 60 minutes or over 90 minutes per week. The mobilization of this blue wave that swept across Quebec totalled no less than 345,700 minutes (or 5,762 hours or 240 days!) of walking.

"COVID-19, exacerbates loneliness for everyone, but even more so for people living with cancer," says Nicole Moreau, a beneficiary of the Telephone Peer Matchina Service offered by the Quebec Cancer Foundation, Nicole received a cancer diagnosis in the midst of confinement and knows how important it is to be supported by professionals with experience in oncology. "More than ever, people with cancer and their loved ones need Accommodation Services combined with the physical well-being and psychological support programs offered by the Foundation."

The Quebec Cancer Foundation warmly thanks all the participants, donors, volunteers and partners for their trust and their humanitarianism.



More than 1,000 people from the business community decided to show their support for the 56,800 Quebecers diagnosed with cancer each year, by participating in the Quebec Cancer Foundation's Corporate Campaign. The 2020 recipients were especially touched by their title and thanked the Foundation with great humility, pledging their support in the years to come.

La course contre le cancer with Dumoulin Compétition

Brothers Jean-François and Louis-Philippe Dumoulin are as passionate about motor sports as they are about the gift of self. This duo, as well as their entire team, are an invaluable source of inspiration for the Quebec Cancer Foundation.

After a very close brush with cancer, Dumoulin Competition got involved with the Foundation in 2016, by having the trunks of their cars signed in exchange of a donation for example. This is how "La course contre le cancer" started: a great way to let off steam every year since! But that's not all. They are also Honorary Presidents of the fundraising campaign in Mauricie and ambassadors of *La marche du Grand défoulement* in Trois-Rivières. Just like on the racetrack, nothing stops them!

Last April, 112 pilots took to the virtual circuit of Road America for the first 6-hour edition of the Sly Sim Racing Virtual Enduro on behalf of Dumoulin Competition's "La course contre le cancer."

The event succeeded beyond all expectations—in terms of subscribers, partners and spectators alike. In only 24

hours, the initial objective was tripled, culminating in a wave of generosity that finally reached the total of \$7,365 donated entirely to the Quebec Cancer Foundation.

Also in the context of Dumoulin Competition's "La course contre le cancer," Somavrac Group employees generously mobilized during "En jeans pour la cause" Fridays, raising a total of \$10,200.

The pandemic may have hit Quebec hard, but the Dumoulin brothers and Dumoulin Competition did not let that get them down. On the contrary— by deploying their determination and creativity in this exceptional year, they managed to raise \$18,425.

Day after day, 12 months per year, the Quebec Cancer Foundation is privileged to be able to count on extraordinary volunteers who dedicate their time and skills to its service.

The solid and unwavering commitment of our regular volunteers is priceless. They all work in solidarity and are the true pillars of the smooth running of the Foundation's operations. They account for 74% of volunteer hours.

Our part-time volunteers are a valuable resource and are the perfect complement to our team. They account for 26% of volunteer hours.



I've always loved driving. I feel completely at ease and even calmer when I'm in a car. Could it be because I was actually born in a car on the Honoré-Mercier Bridge?

Beyond the actual driving, what I also enjoy about being a volunteer driver is the opportunity to meet people. I volunteer at the Foundation 3 days a week, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

My role is to transport the residents of the Hôtellerie de Montréal to their treatment center.

I transport about 20 to 30 people a day in the Foundation's van. On average, these trips add up to 130 km a day in the Greater Montreal area!

Among the residents I transport, I meet talkative passengers, emotional passengers or passengers who are exhausted by their treatments. Whatever their situation, I always offer them an ear they can confide in.

Some of the residents are so grateful that they invite me to spend the holidays at their home and give me gifts —I 've even received pet fishes!"

will allow 3 people impacted by cancer to have access to a one-night accommodation near an oncology center (including meals and transportation).




Where do your donations go? Where does the money come from?
